CHARLES W. "WICK" MOORMAN
Chairman, President & CEO
Norfolk Southern Corporation

Born in 1952 in New Orleans, Wick Moorman has been Chairman of Norfolk Southern since February 2006, Chief Executive Officer since November 2005 and President since October 2004. Prior thereto he served as Senior Vice President Corporate Planning and Services from December 2003 to October 2004, Senior Vice President Corporate Services from February 2003 to December 2003 and President Thoroughbred Technology and Telecommunications, Inc., from 1999 to 2004.

Wick earned his BSCE from Georgia Tech and his MBA from Harvard. While an engineer student, he worked for Southern Railway Company as a cop-op student and upon graduation continued with Southern Railway until 1991 when he began work for Norfolk Southern Corp.

His other activities and affiliations include service on the board of directors for: Association of American Railroads, American Coalition for Clean Coal Electricity (ACCCE), The Chesapeake Bay Foundation, The Eastern Virginia Medical School Foundation and WHRO Foundation. He serves on the board of trustees for: The Chrysler Museum of Art (Chairman) and The Virginia Foundation for Independent Colleges and serves on the advisory boards of: Georgia Tech and International Energy Agency Coal Industry Advisory Board (CIAB)

Wick is an active member of: American Society of Corporate Executives (Treasurer in 2010), Executive Committee (2010-2012); The Business Council; The Business Roundtable; The Kennedy Center Corporate Fund Board; and The Nature Conservancy of Virginia.

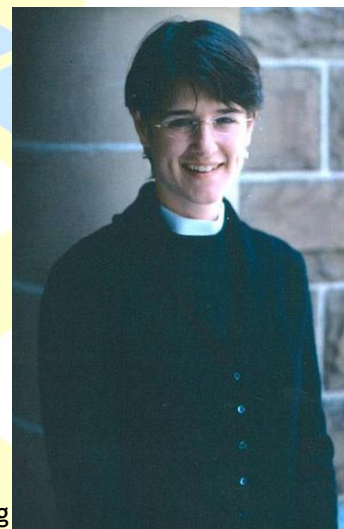

Joseph McConnell Farley
 October 6, 1927 - May 24, 2010

Rotarians are saddened by the loss of Past President Joe Farley who served this club as president from 1983-1984 and continued to share his leadership in many ways. Joe's legacy at Alabama Power Company and as the first Chairman and CEO of Southern Nuclear Operating Company is physically remembered with The Joseph Farley Nuclear Generating Station near Dothan but fellow Rotarians will recollect the time, energy and brain power Joe shared with world leaders in the area of nuclear power generation. Like his service longevity in this Rotary club, Joe had long and rewarding associations with a large number of civic, corporate and educational boards and charities. His service with Tuskegee University and the Alabama Children's Hospital Foundation spanned decades. He remarked often of how impressed he was with the consistent pride and dedication of teams he worked and served with during his life, and always gave them credit for any success.

Charles B. Webb, Jr.

1984-1985 - While serving as Rotary Club of Birmingham's president in 1984-1985, Charles B. Webb, Jr. was the CEO of Alabama Metal Industries in Birmingham (and other locations). He had lived in Pensacola, Florida from 1959 to 1967, working in housing development. He joined Alabama Metal Industries in 1967. Charles Webb was instrumental in establishing the Horizons School and Birmingham's Big Brothers / Big Sister's program. It was said that he ran his Rotary term "with his usual quiet assurance in an easy and open way, indeed, in an elegant style."
